

^^DRESS CODE^^

**The Dress Code for all activities at Harmony Hill is a requirement, not an option.**

^^THE DRESS CODE APPLIES TO **\*\*ALL\*\*** who come to the activity or event, or to preparation days, to attend or to visit, or to help clean up.

**\*\* CHILDREN, YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULTS. \*\*^^**

The definition of the word “**modest**” is defined by Webster thus:  
**‘reserved, proper, decent, quiet, humble, not pretentious’.**

**If you have clothing that might not conform to these guidelines,  
please leave it at home!**

Children 11 years old or younger may wear modest shorts, no short-shorts.

**Boys -** Boys may wear long pants. For coolness and comfort, light-weight cotton ‘high water’ pants may be worn, as long as they are neat, modest, and **cover your knees whether seated or standing**. All shirts must have sleeves.

Waistbands of pants must be worn at the waist, and shirts must be either tucked in at the waist or must hang several inches below the waist on the outside of the pants. Shirt and pants must stay together, whether you are standing, sitting, stooping, reaching, etc.

**Boys** may wear no jewelry other than a class ring and/or a watch.

**Boys** may not wear caps, hats or visors inside the buildings or in class or while eating.

## **DRESS CODE, continued**

**Girls -** Girls may wear long pants, loose-fitting capris, dresses or skirts that completely cover the knees when seated and standing.

Girls who wear sleeveless clothes may be asked to wear a short sleeved blouse as a cover. Shirts/blouses must hang several inches below the top of pants or skirt whether sitting, reaching, standing or stooping. Dresses and shirts/blouses may not have immodestly low-cut necklines. (**Girls**, use caution with this one: today's fashion considers "immodestly low-cut necklines" acceptable. We do not.) Girls may not wear dresses or skirts with "slits" or openings which open the garment above the knees,... or any 'body jewelry' other than finger rings, simple earrings, simple necklaces and watches.. Girls must wear a housecoat or robe over sleepwear, except when sleeping.

**Please do not bring shirts, blouses, or other articles of clothing with slogans, logos or graphics which are inconsistent with our GUIDELINES.**
